CAROLINE ROTHWELL

Through the creation of her hybrid animals and plants, with their skewed sense of scale and environment – a sort of 'nature on acid' – Rothwell's works interrogate the relationships between humans and the natural environment.

Says Curator Clare Lewis, 'Rothwell devises fantastical species and ambiguous narratives which mimic the naive exuberance of Disney, with a toxic edge...'
